SEAMLESS GARMENT We continue today with the second approach to the dilemma of making moral decisions. The deontological (from the Greek word deon, "duty" or "obligation") approach begins with the basic values of human life (such as telling the truth) and holds that we cannot act directly against these values. This method holds that some human acts are morally right or wrong no matter what the consequences. This approach then formulates laws which become the basis for judging the morality of a particular act. Limitation for the deontological approach is the difficulty in formulating laws covering the varieties of moral dilemmas which confront us. An example is medical issues that include so many complexities and conflicts of basic goods that making appropriately finely turned norms is practically impossible.
